I have been attending County Commission Meetings going on for six (6) years now, which included most of the Public Hearings that have been scheduled by these commissioners. To date, this has been the most attended Public Hearing that I can recall, which supercedes both -

- Mark Meadows Congressional Hearing regarding Public Corruption with Something Bruin, and
- The DENR Public Hearing on the Quarry expansion.

The crowd size was estimated at 275. It was a standing room only attendance.

By the way, in all the time I have observed these commissioners, there has never been an extension of a Public Hearing. Something stinks here. At the end of the Public Hearing on Monday, Swanger seemed to have run out of people to speak, yet he extended the public hearing when he could have closed it. Yet he extended it. Why?
