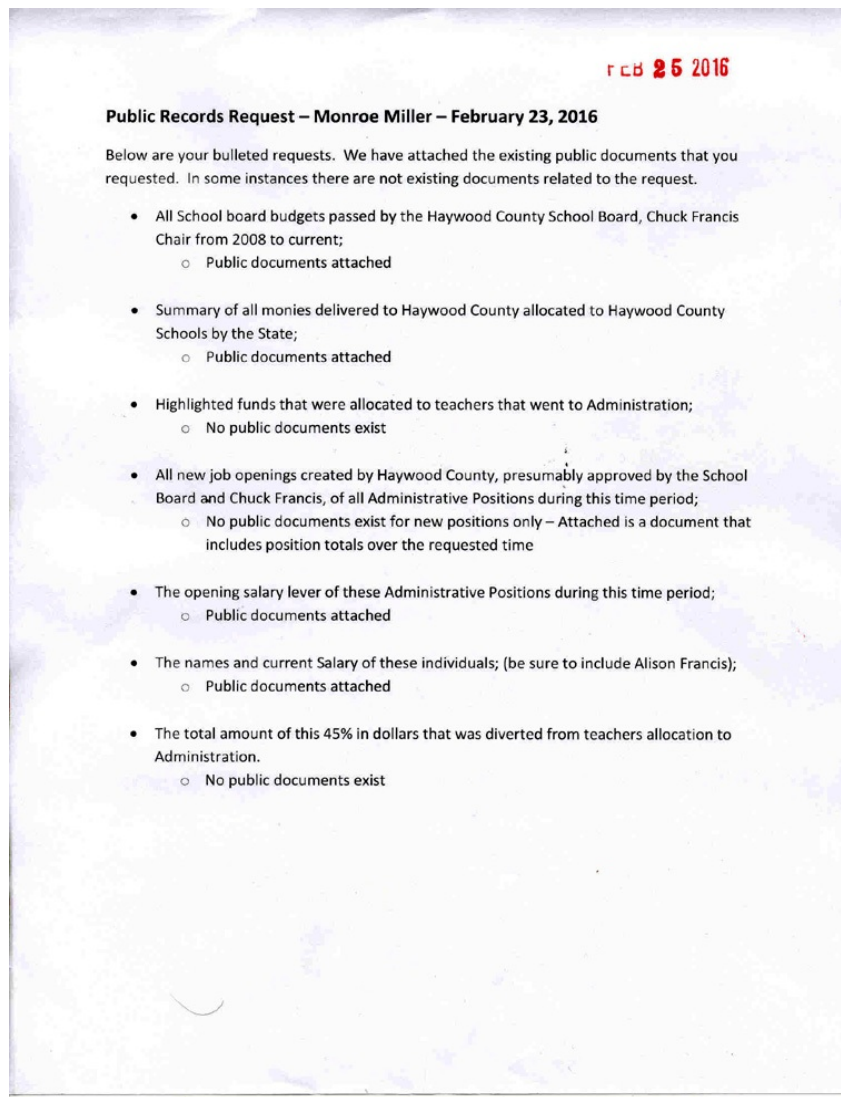

In your response to me on 2/25/2016, in the last bullet item, in response to my Request for Public Information, you said::

- The total amount of the 45% in dollars that ws diverted from teachers allocation to Administration.
  - No public documents exist.

Let me draw your attention to the attachment, 2014-15HaywoodSchoolsBudgetProposal.pdf, pulled off your web site:

On page 13, (the first page of this pdf file) there is a line item "001 CLASSROOM TEACHERS." The total spent in 2013-14 on Classroom Teachers was \$1,907,583.52.

Below Classroom Teachers on page 13, there is a line item "002 CENTRAL OFFICE ADMIN." The total spent on Central Office Admin 2013-14 was \$871,562.14.

A bit of calculation shows us that \$871,562.14 is 45% of \$1,907,583.52 (it actually rounds to 46%, but 45% is a safe, conservative tabulation).

It's important to note that this budget document refers to local county money only. Therefore, the choice to allocate 45% of what was allocated to teachers to administration is solely a Haywood County School Board decision.

So, let me ask for the same Public Information Request in a different way...

How about a complete line-by-line item of both of these referenced categories? "001 CLASSROOM TEACHERS." and "002 CENTRAL OFFICE ADMIN." Does that public document exist?

This could have been done the first time...

By the way, Pat Smathers has been intentionally copied on this 3rd Request for Public Information despite his threat, as I am confident you would have forwarded this information to him as soon as you received it, so now you don't have to. He already gets it.

Mr. Nolte,

This request (#6) is uniquely different than my request (#5) that you just acknowledged. You know, I got to thinking while I was shaving this morning (that is when my mind is clearest) ... I never received any revenue information from you when I requested the budget data.

If you look at the county budget prepared by Julie Davis [re: <http://haywoodtp.net/pubII/140616CrackedTheCode.pdf>], her first section is Revenue. She lists all the sources of county revenue, i.e., ad valorem taxes, state and local sales tax, fees, etc., and comes up with a total. Then expenses are listed, and at the end of the document, revenues are balanced against expenses.

I think even Robin Black, a CPA who is running for Haywood County Commissioner, who said she has previously reviewed school budgets, would have to agree with me here. You need to examine both revenues and expenditures to get the whole picture.

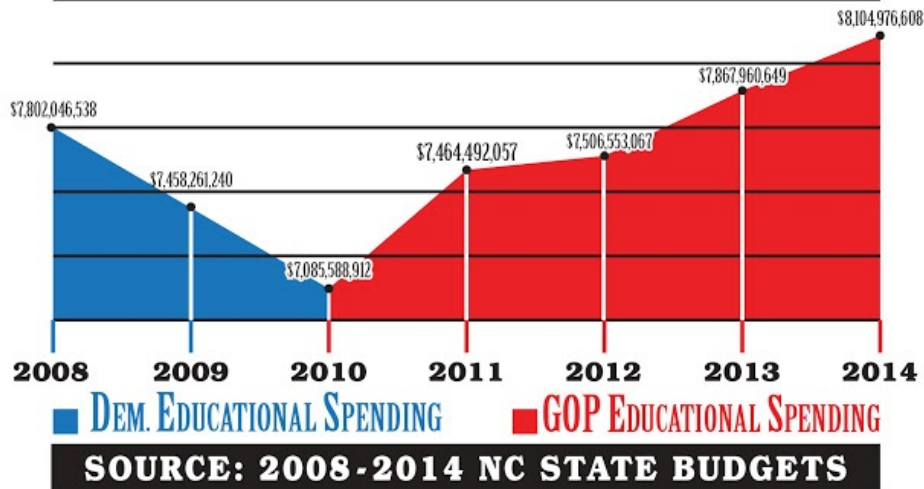
