Additionally, when bids are opened on 3/3/2020, I am requesting in advance that you scan all bid responses and send them to me, before **David Francis** has a chance to close the folders and send them off to **McGill** or whatever place he intends to conceal them, out of reach of Public Records Requests.

If this process goes the same way as bids were handled for the **David Francis** Dirt Spreading Project, I will not hesitate to file a complaint against you with the North Carolina Ethics Commission [<https://ethics.ncsbe.gov/>].
