# FY 2010-2011 Proposed Budget

- Revenues and Expenditures Identified
- General Fund Balanced at \$65,934,562
- Special Revenue Funds Balanced
- No public comment on budget other than
- Fund 24 Solid Waste

## Household Availability Fee

- Currently \$70
- Anticipated increase of \$40 to cover debt service for White Oak Landfill and DENR required capital projects
- Proposed Budget includes an increase of \$22 to \$92 per household

# FY 2010-2011 Proposed Budget

- Fund 24 Solid Waste Balanced with \$22 increase in availability fee to \$92 per household which includes the following:
  - Contracting Out Convenience Center Operations at a projected savings of \$145,192 per year
  - Haul all blue bags (from towns, convenience centers) out of county – Projected savings of \$286,166 and continue to generate revenue from cardboard, paper, metals, etc.

#### Closure of Transfer Station

- Eliminates majority of fixed costs and recurring capital expenditures
- Projected Savings of \$940,000
- Necessary improvements to White Oak Landfill:
  - New scale house, scales, truck wash, road improvements & large convenience center
  - Design, Bid & Construction: 6 to 8 months
  - Estimated project cost of \$750,000

#### DENR Required Closure & Post-Closure Costs at White Oak Landfill

- \$273,867 per acre
  - ▶ 21.5 acres with waste currently\$ 5,888,144
  - ▶ 8.8 acres new cell\$ 2,410,031
  - ▶ 30.3 acres future cells\$ 8,298,170
  - ► Total\$16,596,345
- Equates to \$414,909 per year over 40 years in "2009 dollars"
- \$12.81 per household annually
